1.0 PURPOSE

To allow for exemption from the Program of Continuing Competency (PCC) for registrants who have been approved within the non-practicing classification due to a mental health medical condition/diagnosis, and or a physical injury/treatment for whom the engagement in a PCC would be considered detrimental by their Health Care professional whose care they are under as being detrimental

2.0 DEFINITIONS

Program for Continuing Competency: (PCC) as approved by the Council of the College of Paramedics of Manitoba

Registration Year: April 1 – March 31 annually

Non-practicing Registrant: A registrant who is currently registered in the non-Practicing classification with the College of Paramedics of Manitoba.

3.0 POLICY

- 3.1 Any registrant who has received approval to be classified as non-practicing due to a mental health diagnosis, may be considered for EXEMPTION from participating in the Program for Continuing Competency (PCC) for the remainder of that registration year
- 3.2 Please note: this policy applies only to registrants who have a mental health diagnosis and or a physical injury/treatment which currently prevents them from practicing paramedicine safely and **does not apply** to registrants who are registered in the non-practicing classification due to a statutory leave, or a leave authorized by their employer or the council.

4.0 PROCEDURE

- 4.1 Approval for exemption is on a case-by-case basis and at the discretion of the College of Paramedics of Manitoba. The College also reserves the right to request additional documentation/communication with the Health Care professional.
- 4.2 The registrant must provide documentation from a Health Care professional whose care they are under, which clearly provides the justification (reasons engaging the

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- PCC could be detrimental) for the exemption from the annual PCC requirement under the Regulated Health Professions Act.
- 4.3 The registrant must provide this documentation annually (at or before the annual registration renewal) from their Health Care professional whose care they are under for this exemption.
- 4.4 The registrant, depending on the length of time for the approved leave of absence due to a mental health diagnosis and or a physical injury/treatment, will be required to undergo an "on-boarding" process by the employer and/or a clinical practice assessment (which may indicate the need to engage a refresher education program and/or training, or a full education program) prior to returning to the Full registration classification,
- 4.5 The registrant will be required to participate in the PCC once they have transitioned to the Full classification and "active" status
