To state the criteria and procedures for making available to the public disciplinary decisions of the council, a panel of the Inquiry Committee, voluntary surrenders and censures, and cancellations of registration or certificates of practice by the council.

# 3.0 <u>POLICY</u>

- 1. The College shall publish decisions in keeping with the requirements of the applicable legislation (*The Regulated Health Professions Act*/ and for the purpose of:
  - a. being accountable to the public for actions taken;
  - b. preventing unacceptable practice by providing information/education to registrants about unacceptable conduct for their future guidance;
  - c. providing information to registrants about College processes.
- 2. Decisions will be made available to the public through publication. Publication refers to communication of registrant or former registrant information on the College website and any other means of communication deemed necessary by the Executive Director/Registrar in the interest of the protection of the public.
- 3. Publication will include information that is available to the public under applicable legislation (*The Regulated Health Professions Act*/, including the registrant's name and registration number, unless:
  - a. the information is not to be made public under the applicable legislation (*The Regulated Health Professions Act*);
  - b. disclosure of the registrant's name and registration number could reasonably be anticipated to discourage the public from initiating complaints to the College; or
  - c. disclosure of the registrant's name and registration number could reasonably be anticipated to compromise the anonymity of the complainant or other parties incidentally involved in a matter.

- 4. The following guidelines shall apply to any publication:
  - a. The information required to be published shall be available for at least the length of time required under the Act, as of the date of this policy that period time includes decisions in the "current calendar year or the 10 previous calendar years".
  - b. The privacy of persons other than the registrant participating in the process must be protected by publishing the minimum amount of personal information necessary to effectively communicate the circumstances and the reasons for decision.
  - c. When considering the publication of personal or financial information regarding a registrant, the College shall consider whether the privacy interest of the registrant outweighs the public interest in making the information available. The dignity of the registrant must be respected by publishing the minimum amount of personal or financial information necessary to effectively communicate the circumstances and the reasons for the decision.
  - d. The College shall consider whether a person involved in a criminal proceeding, or a civil suit or proceeding may be prejudiced; or
  - e. The College shall consider whether the safety of a person may be jeopardized.
  - f. In circumstances where the decision includes that the registrant's name and registration number are not to be included in the publication, an explanation of the reason for withholding the registrant's name shall be included in the publication.
