



Statement from the Executive Director/Registrar of the College of Paramedics of Manitoba

Public Censure - CPMB Registrant (Tiana Charban)

The College of Paramedics of Manitoba protects the public interest by following the professional conduct processes described in *The Regulated Health Professions Act (RHPA)*.

The profession of paramedicine became self-regulated on December 1, 2020. Censure creates a disciplinary record which may be considered in the future by CIC or an Inquiry Committee when determining the action to be taken following an investigation or hearing.

Accepting Censure by a registrant demonstrates acknowledgement and personal accountability of the matter.

Decisions of the Complaints Investigation Committee related to public censure may be published as required by the RHPA s. 104(2). The purpose of the publication is to demonstrate to the public that the College and its regulated members, takes appropriate action on serious conduct matters.

The Complaints Investigation Committee decision is a reminder to paramedics that they must always hold themselves accountable to their profession's Code of Ethics and Standards of Practice.
