



Complaints Investigation Committee Decision

Voluntary Surrender – CPMB Registrant Byron Hernandez

Background

On April 9, 2024, an employer report was received that raised concerns regarding compliance to the employer's protocols and procedures.

The Registrar referred to the employer report to the Complaints Investigation Committee (CIC). The CIC reviewed the employer report and appointed an investigator to review the case on October 2, 2024.

Decision

On January 24, 2025, the College of Paramedics of Manitoba, Complaints Investigation Committee reviewed the investigator's report. The Complaints Investigation Committee (CIC) of the College of Paramedics of Manitoba concluded that the investigated member did not comply with the Code of Ethics, Standards of Practice and Practice Directions of the college.

As the registrant had been cooperative throughout the process, to conclude the matter, the Committee offered to accept the registrant's voluntary surrender of their registration. If the registrant ever seeks to reinstate, the Complaints Investigation Committee requires the following conditions to be met:

- a. Complete paramedic re-training at an approved Primary Care Paramedic program in the Province of Manitoba;
- b. Successfully pass the Entry-to-Practice exam; and
- c. Meet all other requirements for registration as a "New Applicant" with the College.

The registrant agreed to the voluntary surrender of their registration on March 12th, 2025
